

A Special Bond



With your help, the Children's Home Network is dedicated to improving lives and changing life stories of the children and families we serve. Unfortunately, statistics reveal that for teens in foster care, the future is more likely to include arrests and incarceration. The Children's Home Network together with a group of foster families strive to overcome and defy this unfortunate outcome for all of the children in our care.

17-year-old Adam never knew stability, safety, or consistent parenting throughout his life. He never met his father, and his mother struggled with chronic depression, PTSD, drug addiction and suspected involvement in prostitution. Adam's mother was sexually traumatized and turned to substance abuse to numb her pain and avoid confronting her painful past. Unable to care for her son, Adam was placed in foster care and was eventually adopted by a family member.

Sadly, chaos continued in Adam's life, and he came back into care as a young teen when his adoptive family abandoned him. It was learned that during his time with this caregiver, Adam was sexually molested, adding to the trauma he had already experienced. Trying to manage the abandonment and trauma he experienced was overwhelming and Adam's behaviors and mental health quickly deteriorated.

Adjustment to foster care and the structure of family was difficult for Adam and he challenged his caregivers often. Fortunately, when he was 15, Adam was placed into the care of Mr. Davis, a Children's Home Network specialized therapeutic foster parent. Mr. Davis became licensed as a foster parent with the motivation and commitment to care for teen males, specifically those who struggled with identity, abandonment and self-acceptance. Mr. Davis' desire has always been to empower young men to recognize their self-worth and value. CHN and Mr. Davis, advocated relentlessly to obtain the tools and resources Adam needed to heal from his traumatic past. Mr. Davis began to see Adam evolve. With the support of CHN, Mr. Davis did not see the negative but the opportunity. He was not discouraged by Adam's past, but saw the potential in a young man that others would have considered hopeless.

Once placed into Mr. Davis' care, Adam finally seemed to relax and eventually connect with his foster dad. Adam did not trust others and still carried all the emotional wounds from his childhood, but he did allow himself to feel at home in his foster father's care. Unfortunately, Adam did have additional behavioral issues that needed to be addressed, but, Mr. Davis did not give up on him. He continued to advocate for Adam and pushed for him to receive intense and specialized treatment he needed to heal. For the next year while Adam resided in a treatment program, Mr. Davis remained in contact with Adam and participated in family therapy, soon becoming the father that Adam never had. With the critical support and encouragement of a safe 'parent', Adam was willing to participate in his treatment and he successfully completed the program.

Adam and Mr. Davis created such a special bond that they recently became a forever family by way of adoption. Adam is now a star student and in the gifted program. Looking to his future, Adam is taking pre-medical courses as an elective in school and enjoys playing basketball where his father can be found cheering him on at the sidelines.

Prior to this, Adam was destined to become another tragic statistic. Fortunately, because of donors like you, he was able to overcome the odds and with love and support from his foster dad and the Children's Home Network, he is thriving. The future looks bright for Adam, and we couldn't be happier!

Sibling Love



9-year-old Renee, and her 10-year-old brother, Chase, have always been close. They enjoy playing board games and love pepperoni pizza. Since they were little, they have relied on each other for safety and comfort. This bond was inevitable due to their tragic childhood.

Raised in a single-parent household, finances were tight and basic amenities were hard to come by. Their mother also struggled with a drug addiction and was often absent, leaving Renee and Chase to care for themselves. Although she loved her children, she was unable to properly care for them.

In January of 2018, the siblings were removed from their home and were admitted to the Kids Village program at the Children's Home Network. Terrified of being separated, Renee and Chase begged to stay together. Our intake team reassured them that they would not be separated. Thanks to supporters like you, they immediately began receiving the therapeutic treatment they needed to heal.

As the siblings began adjusting to their new environment on campus, the Childrens' Home Network was notified that Renee and Chase had a older brother, Derek. Although he was an adult and was interested in caring for them, it was not feasible due to his housing and financial situation.

In the summer of 2020, Lacey, a CHN Kinship Family Finding Specialist, reconnected with Derek to see if he had any relatives that could be a possible placement for his younger siblings. Derek, now older, was eager to help. His financial and living situation had changed, and he was willing to do whatever it took to get his brother and sister out of foster care.

For weeks, Lacey, Derek, and a case management team worked together to ensure this would be the best placement for Renee and Chase. After thorough evaluations, background checks, weekend and overnight visits, all three siblings were placed together on May 28th, 2021! Derek continues to work closely with the Kinship team for support and connection to resources. Thanks to the generosity of donors like you, and CHN's Kids Village and Kinship programs, this family is on the path to a long and fulfilled future.



Summer Fun!


